## Preparing for an upcoming General Obligation Bond vote in May, 2018.

In the spring of this year the school district secured technical assistance grants for facility assessment, long range planning and seismic facility assessment. This work was completed in time to send a report to the Oregon Department of Education (ODE), by the deadline of September 1, 2017.

In my role as Superintendent, I met with the staff and community members developing a list of facility projects. During the month of September, I met with staff and community members fielding their requests for projects. A concise list of projects was produced and used for meeting in October to prioritize the various projects. In addition to these meetings, we hired ACC Cost Consultants to give us cost projections for the projects.

The Harrisburg School District Board of Directors will take all of this information and begin the discussion. The goal will be to make a decision on general projects at each building and the bond levy amount at the December school board meeting.

Our current bond will sunset June of 2019 and our goal is to fold a new bond into the old bond. Also, ODE has selected five other school districts to receive a matching grant, if they have a successful bod election in May 2018. If one of the five school districts fails to pass their bond, Harrisburg SD moves into position to receive a matching grant.
